Training Workshop:

- Establishment of a Bamboo Art & Craft Network: Create a network or community platform where participants can stay connected, share experiences, and collaborate on projects. This network can serve as a support system for ongoing learning and professional development.
- Integration into Curriculum: Advocate for the integration of bamboo art and craft workshops or modules into the educational curriculum of education institutions. This ensures that future generations have access to training and knowledge in this traditional craft.
- Promotion of Entrepreneurship: Provide support and resources for participants
 interested in pursuing entrepreneurship in bamboo art and craft. This could
 include business mentoring, access to markets, or assistance with product
 development and marketing.
- Cultural Exchange Programs: Explore opportunities for cultural exchange programs with other institutions or communities involved in bamboo art and craft.
 This can broaden perspectives, facilitate learning from different traditions, and foster cross-cultural understanding.
- Public Exhibitions and Events: Organize public exhibitions or events to showcase the works created by workshop participants. This not only provides them with opportunities to display their talents but also raises awareness and appreciation for bamboo art and craft within the wider community.
- Community Engagement: Engage local communities in the process of bamboo art and craft by organizing outreach programs, workshops, or demonstrations. This fosters community pride, strengthens social ties, and ensures the continuity of traditional knowledge and skills.

Implementing these recommendations can help maximize the impact of the workshop and sustain its benefits in the long term, enriching both individuals and communities involved in bamboo art and craft.
