Venue: Botany PG Laboratory

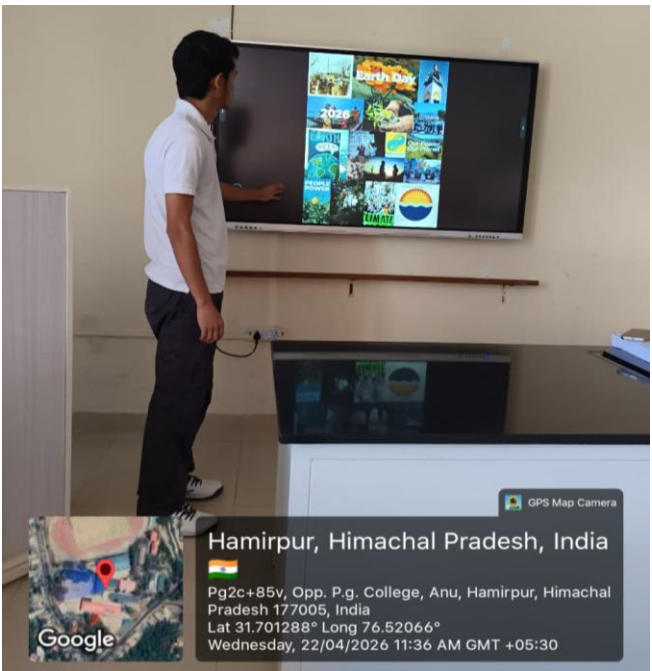
Organisers: Eco Club and Department of Botany in collaboration with J.C. Bose Botanical Society
